Guiding Principles: Medicinal Cannabis

Following feedback from VicTAG members regarding the complexity of managing medicinal cannabis in a hospital setting, VicTAG have developed a Guiding Principles document that is intended to assist decision-making by health professionals, consumers and Drug and Therapeutics Committees in the evaluation, approval and use of these medicines. It is available on the Guidelines section of the website provides advice on prescribing, accessing, supplying and storage of medicinal cannabis products, including patient's own medicinal cannabis.

Chemotherapy Audit Toolkit

The Victorian Therapeutics Advisory Group (VicTAG), supported by the Victorian Government, commissioned the creation of a Chemotherapy Audit Toolkit for use by health services in Victoria, which has now been completed. The Chemotherapy Audit Toolkit is designed for health services to implement best practice management of chemotherapy prescribing variations and to provide auditing methods that are targeted and validated. The toolkit consists of two elements: a best practice framework for the evidence to patient process and a suite of tools for auditing variations in chemotherapy prescribing. Last year, the VicTAG Management Committee released an Expression of Interest for a member to lead the Medication Safety Alert developed for 12 months. Under Toni's leadership and the valuable input from the VicTAG QUM Medication Safety Alerts subgroup, five new Medication Safety Alerts have been finalised and are available on the website.

For 2019, due to significant member interest, the VicTAG Management Committee sought expressions of interest for two key projects in place of the annual grant application round. Following a high calibre of applications, the two successful applicants were:

1. Grace Wong, Western Health to lead the development of the Victorian Framework for Handling and Disposal of Pharmaceutical Waste – due to commence November 2019
2. Bishma Jayathilaka will lead a team of contributors from the Parkville Precinct hospitals to develop the Safe Handling of Medicines Framework – due to commence March 2020

High-risk medicines online learning modules

Victorian public health service clinicians are able to access the online High Risk Medicines course developed by SA Health. The course currently features four modules including :

1. Introduction to high risk medicines
2. Anticoagulants
3. Clozapine
4. Insulin

An opioids module will be released later in 2019, with one further module to be developed in 2020.

Activities undertaken by VicTAG in 2019

VicTAG has continued to support medicines access, quality and safety for member hospitals through a range of activities including the following:

- Contribution to the submission of Victoria's medication safety priorities to the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Healthcare (ACSQHC)
- Feedback provided to the Department of Health and Human Services on the draft core capability framework for Pharmacy and Medicines Management
- Submission of feedback to the ACSQHC on the national response to the WHO Global Patient Safety Challenge – *Medication without harm* (led by the VicTAG QUM Group)
- Responded to the consultation on the proposed general authorisation allowing Victorian Nurse Practitioners to supply and prescribe medicines to their full scope of practice.
- Continue to liaise with the SafeScript team regarding implications and implementation in hospitals
- Organised a Members meeting on the statewide pharmacy service for Voluntary Assisted Dying
- Co-organisers of the Medicines Roundtable
- Coordinated and contributed members to undertake the HPV clinical products evaluation (led by the VicTAG QUM Group)

Activities flagged for 2020 include:

- Development of Guiding Principles for the Management of Schedule 8 medicines and Schedule 4 drugs of dependence
- Guidance document for Pharmaceutical representatives attending Victorian hospitals

VicTAG QUM Group

The VicTAG QUM group provides a support network for VicTAG member hospitals to identify issues which increase the risk of medication error and determine practices to improve medication safety. The group meets every 2 months, alternating between face to face meetings and teleconferences and has an active email discussion forum.
